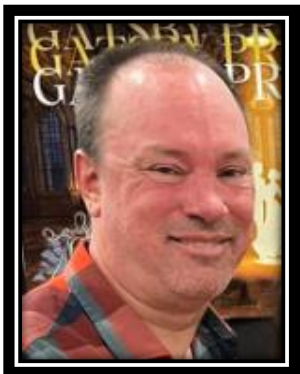


TROJAN HALL OF FAME 2025 INDUCTEES



Chris Feist

Chris graduated from Fife High in 1995 and was a State Champion wrestler for the Trojans. He went on to become an All-American wrestler for Central Washington University, earning an education degree in 2000. Chris immediately began teaching and coaching at Tahoma HS. After four years as an assistant wrestling coach, he took over as the head coach and is preparing for his 22nd year at the helm. Chris is one of the winningest coaches in WA State history. His teams have won 4 State team titles and Chris has produced 25 individual State Champions. When he is not on the mat, Chris grapples with students at Tahoma High School as an Associate Principal.



Brian Meyer

Behind every great program is a leader who 'gets it'. Brian gets it. Brian brought his teaching and coaching talents to Fife High in 2001. As a social studies teacher, he continues to prepare students by teaching AP courses in US government and history. As the head track & field coach since 2001, Brian's teams won 13 league titles and his girls team captured the State title in 2018. In 2016, Brian became the ASB Advisor, helping students navigate leadership, the Cabbage Patch Olympics, Homecoming, and student life at Fife. Most important, his students believe, Brian was laying the groundwork for the Inclusion Revolution and Unified Sports long before they were a thing.



Ryann Waldman Wellington

Ryann graduated from Fife High in 2009. As a Trojan, she earned varsity letters in softball (1), track (2), basketball (3), and soccer (3) where she shined as the goalkeeper. Ryann led Fife to State titles in 2007 and 2008, only allowing 1 goal her entire senior season. She played soccer while attending Weber State University and received an education degree. Ryann returned home to teach, starting at SLMS and now CJH, and coach. Naturally, she worked her way up to head coach of the Trojan girls' soccer team. In Ryann's 6 seasons as HC, the Trojans amassed 102 wins, 4 ties, and only 11 losses, leading to 6 straight league titles and 6 State tournament appearances.



Cam Booser

Cam is a 2010 graduate of Fife High. He led the baseball team in each of his 3 seasons as a pitcher and outfielder. Cam received a scholarship to Oregon State, pitching as a true freshman. After college, he signed free agent contracts, but, discouraged by injuries, walked away from the game in 2017. Cam was back on the mound and pain free in 2021. He began the '24 season in the minors and was called up by the Boston Red Sox in April. Cam received the Tony Conigliaro Award as the 'major leaguer who has overcome adversity through spirit, determination, and courage'. Cam is currently anchoring the Chicago White Sox bullpen. The true heart of a Trojan.



Kaleb McGary

Kaleb graduated from Fife in 2014. A standout in both football and basketball, he accepted a football scholarship from the UW. During his collegiate career, Kaleb started 47 of 53 games at right tackle. As a senior, he won the Morris Trophy as the best offensive lineman in the PAC 12. Kaleb was selected by the Atlanta Falcons with the 31st overall pick in the first round of the 2019 NFL draft. He started all 16 games at right tackle during his rookie year and has played in 93 out of 99 games since entering the NFL. Now in his 7th year with the Falcons, Kaleb has signed a contract extension through the 2027 season.
