Shane Nixon

After receiving his degree at WSU, Shane began his career at Fife High School in 1999. He was hired to teach mathematics and coach both baseball and football. In over 20 years as the head baseball coach, Shane has been recognized as the league's Coach of the Year six times, most recently in 2021, and statewide in 2018. He transitioned to Athletic Director in 2016 and has spent countless hours preparing and guiding teams, athletes, and families. Those efforts earned Shane the 2A SPSL Athletic Director of the Year honor in 2020. He is also the current president of the 2A SPSL. Shane's loyalty to Fife High and the community has never wavered.



Roger Scott

Roger graduated from Fife High School with the class of 1980. He immediately began coaching baseball at the high school with Ron Rood. After 15 years working with the Men's Warehouse, the desire to follow his heart won out. Roger received his teaching certificate and has been a teacher and coach at SLMS for the past 20 years. If your child had 6th grade science, played baseball, soccer, or wrestled at SLMS, then you know that he genuinely cares for them beyond their academic and athletic achievements. Roger has been a dedicated teacher and coach to multiple generations of Fife alumni.



Mark Schelbert

Mark started his career as a teacher and coach at Fife High in 1998. Over the past 23 years as head basketball coach, he has amassed over 300 wins, 2 league championships, 2 district championships, and 9 State tournament appearances. Mark has been voted Coach of the Year four times so far. He has also helped build some of the most competitive programs for both the boys and girls tennis teams as an assistant coach the past 14 years. On the court or in the classroom, he prioritizes academics, work ethic, and accountability to focus on the student as a whole and to promote life-long success.



John Shula

John graduated from Fife High School in 1980. He began teaching at SLMS in 1989 as a science teacher. In 1994, John was diagnosed with chronic lymphocytic leukemia. He continued to teach and incorporated his diagnosis and treatment into his teaching. John transitioned to Fife High in 2000. This was the birth of Trojan Digital Media and his classes have earned several NW Emmy nominations. In 2004, John was in the hospital after a bone marrow transplant to treat his Leukemia. His students wanted to buy him an iPod to keep him busy and started Shulapalooza as a way to raise money for it. Since then, under John's leadership, Shulapalooza has raised over \$25,000 for the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. John truly has the heart of a Trojan.



Kent Nevin

He is the winningest coach in Trojan football history. Kent was hired in 2003 to teach social studies, leadership, and conditioning. He was also hired as the head football coach and as an assistant coach for track & field. Kent is a 4 time 2A SPSL Coach of the Year. In 2018, he was named All-Area Coach of the Year by the Tacoma News Tribune and WA High School Coach of the Year by the National Football Foundation. However, being awarded the Heart of the Trojan by the students in 2019 tops them all. Kent's message has always been ATF – Always Team First – for his core belief that lifting others up, together, makes us a stronger team and community.
